







Blessed Carmelites for the month of April



Blessed Baptist Spagnoli of Mantua was born on 17th April 1447 to a family of civil servants to the Dukes of Mantua. He entered the Carmelites of the Congregation of Mantua at Ferrara as a young man and had a stellar rise in academics and administration of his order.

While not a poet of genius, he was a superb Latin stylist, imitating Virgil. His eclogues were used in European schools for a century and a half after his death as a model of style and he was quoted by Shakespeare, Boswell, and Nashe. He was friends with many of the leading Renaissance humanists, including the two Pico della Mirandolas, with whom some correspondence survives.

He made his religious profession in 1464 and served in many positions of responsibility in the community in addition to his literary work. Baptist performed a number of diplomatic missions for the

popes; he was vicar general of his congregation six times and in 1513 he was elected Prior General of the whole Order. He was a renowned humanist who brought his richley varied poetry into the service of Christ.

He is the only Carmelite quoted in the works of William Shakespeare: "Vir sapis qui pauca loquitu" (That man is wise who talks little) from Love's Labor Lost, Act IV, scene 2, line 95. He used his friendship with scholars as an opportunity of encouraging them to live a Christian life. He died in Mantua on 20th March 1516. Baptista Mantuanus was beatified in 1890. His beatification is commemorated on April 17th.



Mary Of The Incarnation (born Feb. 26, 1566, Paris—died April 18, 1618, Pontoise, Fr.) was a mystic whose activity and influence in religious affairs inspired most of the leading French ecclesiastics of her time.

Although Mary wished to be a nun, her parents insisted that she marry (1582) Pierre Acarie, vicomte de Villemore. With the aid of King Henry IV of France and his wife, Marie de Médicis, she brought the Carmelite nuns to Paris, leading to the introduction into France in 1604 of the Discalced Carmelites, an order of meditative, cloistered nuns. She helped to reform the French Benedictine convents and worked for the expansion of the Ursulines. She encouraged her

cousin Cardinal Pierre de Bérulle to found (1611) the Oratory, a congregation of priests that played an important part in the religious development of France in the 17th century.

After Pierre's death (1613), she entered the Carmelite convent at Amiens, Fr., where she made her vows in 1615, taking the name of Mary of the Incarnation. She was beatified in 1791 by Pope Pius VI, and her traditional beatification is commemorated on April 18th.



Teresa Maria Manetti was born on 3 March 1846 in a small village outside of Florence.

At the age of eighteen, Teresa Maria gathered a group of women who were all teachers; the group soon became exposed to the writings of St. Teresa of Avila, and soon enough a devotion to her grew.

There she founded a congregation. It received approval from Pope Pius X on 27 February 1904 as the Carmelite Sisters of Saint Teresa.


Their mission was to teach children, with an emphasis on orphans. Houses eventually opened in Syria and Palestine after the approval was granted. Teresa Maria of the Cross contracted a grave illness in 1908 which intensified until she died on 23 April 1910.

The cause for beatification commenced in Florence in the 1930s.

Pope Paul VI approved the findings of the Congregation for the Causes of Saints and approved the fact that she had lived a life of heroic virtue. As a result, on 23 May 1975, he declared her to be Venerable.

Pope John Paul II approved a miracle attributed to her intercession on 16 November 1985 and beatified her on 19 October 1986. Her beatification is commemorated on April 23rd.

What's in a date? How the day of Easter is determined.


Easter is celebrated on the first Sunday after the first full moon on or after 21 March a fixed approximation of the March equinox. Count back 40 days and you will identify the first day of Lent - Ash Wednesday. Determining the Easter date in advance requires a correlation between the lunar months and the solar year, while also accounting for the month, date, and weekday of the Julian or Gregorian calendar. The complexity of the algorithm arises because of the desire to associate the date of Easter to correlate Holy Week as closely as possible with the date of the Jewish feast of Passover.


The word "lent" means "spring" or "the lengthening of days." The word Easter comes from the German word for "east.," and an older Latin word meaning "dawn."

Saturday, March, 22nd was a special day at The National Shrine of Our Lady of Mount Carmel. 




We pray for our brothers Ryan Resurrection O.Carm and Gregg Durham, O.Carm who both helped at the Shrine during their years of formation.






